AS A BODY IS ONE

Paul teaches that Jesus' followers are united, but not just in a common faith. He sees a real physical and mental link between us and uses the human body as an illustration. Your body has many individual components: hands, feet, eyes, bones, etc. Today, we might compare it with a computer that has a monitor and a keyboard and a central processor, modem, all linked together. Each part is harmonized by our brain, or more specifically, by our soul. When the soul leaves the body, the individual parts no longer act in harmony. The Holy Spirit is the connecting link in our faith-body, harmonizing all of our individual gifts for the benefit of the whole community.

Thank You— The Knights of Columbus wish to thank parishioners for their donations of food and money to the annual Lenten food drive.
