SOSTHENES, OUR BROTHER

Paul had come to Corinth after a debacle in Athens. He had been literally laughed out of town by the Board of Philosophers, which granted licenses to teach. Discouraged, he traveled about 60 miles away to Corinth, a city with two ports. Expecting to remain only a few days, he proved such a success that his visit lasted 18 months. It came to a dramatic conclusion when several members of the local Synagogue dragged Paul before a pagan Gallio, judge. magistrate, refused to listen to the case. So the people from Synagogue beat up their leader, Sosthenes. The story has a happy ending because Sosthenes becomes one of Paul's co-

In Memory of Pope Benedict XVI

This weekend's Masses memorialize Pope Benedict XVI, who died Dec. 31 at the age of 95.

He served as pope from 2005 until 2013, when he resigned due to ill health. He was born Joseph Ratzinger in Germany in 1927 and was known for his intelligence, humility and gentleness. He spoke several languages,

was an accomplished pianist and was ordained a priest in 1951. A fierce defender of church dogma, he served as Pope John Paul II's closest adviser for more than two decades. At age 78, he was the oldest newly elected pope since Clement XII (1730–40). And at age 86, he was the first pope since Gregory XII (in 1415) to abdicate the papacy.
