## WHY CHOOSE BARABBAS?

Pontius Pilate tried to avoid trouble at Jesus' trial. He was not sympathetic but to save face, he offered the crowd a choice to free Jesus or a recently arrested brigand by the name of Barabbas. "Barabbas" (bar abba) means "son of the father" and was commonly used for illegitimate children. The irony is that Jesus is the true Son of the ultimate Father. Brigands were often considered folk heroes because they attacked the rich, making them popular with the poor. Pilate's ploy to free Jesus failed because of Barabbas' popularity and the pressure of the religious and political leaders. Jesus was arrested secretly, before many of his followers had time to gather. Barabbas, on the other hand, had time to marshal his friends and won the day.
