# Eternal Life LIVING WATER

Eskimos have many different words for snow, describing different kinds of snow. A similar diversity of words for water is true of people of Middle Eastern desert. Today, Jesus speaks of "living water" literally "flowing" water as opposed to water that accumulates in pools or wells. Standing water can become stagnant and less desirable in taste than water flowing from a spring or river. The Samaritan woman offers to draw water from the well, but Jesus offers her the livina varietv. Apparently he is referring to the water of Baptism, which allows the baptized to become sources of life themselves.
