GET BEHIND ME SATAN!

Poor Peter. Jesus promises to build his church "upon this rock" then he calls him "Satan." The apostle has had an insight into Jesus' nature. He fails to understand the mission of Christ. When Jesus predicts his own death, Peter takes him aside and urges him to "cool it." That kind of talk will not attract more followers. As much for the benefit of the others, Jesus tells Peter that he is judging the mission by human standards. He calls him a temptor. In the book of Job, Satan is a sort of aid to God. His mission is to test souls to prove their worthiness for God's blessings. Only in later theology does Satan become equated with the devil. Jesus isn't calling Peter diabolical; he is simply advising him to get with the program through self-sacrifice.
