John the Baptist makes both an act of humility and an act of hope for coming superior. Sandals were the most common and least valuable of possessions. They were thongs made of animal skin or plant fiber. They consisted in a flat sole tied to the foot with straps. It was the duty of a slave to tie these straps for a superior. John pictures the "one who is to come" as so great that the Baptist is unfit even to be his slave.
