The disease called leprosy is a disfiguring illness in which ulcers and gangrene develop on human bodies. In ancient times people feared it so much that they labeled anything that even leprous appeared to be infected. Thus conditions as widely ranging as mildew, rust and cancer were all grouped under its name. Anyone infected with apparent symptoms was guarantined. They could lose their homes, families and careers. Priests were called upon to give victims detailed examinations. The verdict of the priests could condemn people to a living hell.

<u>Ash Wednesday</u> — Following is the schedule for Ash Wednesday services:

- Noon, communion service in English
- 6 p.m., Mass in Spanish
- 7 p.m., communion service in English

By Canon Law, Father can celebrate only two Masses per weekday. Also, he is not allowed to celebrate communion services, only Masses. Since the deacons at both St. Elizabeth and St. Anthony do not speak Spanish, the Spanish services at both parishes are Masses. However, Father plans to help distribute ashes at the communion services.

<u>Lenten Regulations</u> — Fast and abstinence rules apply for Catholics during Lent under the following situations:

- Abstinence from meat is expected for those age 14 and up on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent.
- Fasting is expected for those ages 18-59 on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. That means no more than one full meal and two smaller meals and also no snacking.

<u>Stations of the Cross</u> — Come pray the Way of the Cross on Fridays during Lent at 6 p.m. in English and at 7 p.m. in Spanish, starting Friday.

<u>Lent Books</u> — Free adult Lenten reflection books are in the vestibule. Please take one.

<u>Youth Group</u> — The Youth Group will meet for an afternoon of lunch and games from 1:30 to 4 p.m. this Sunday (Feb. 11) at the church.
